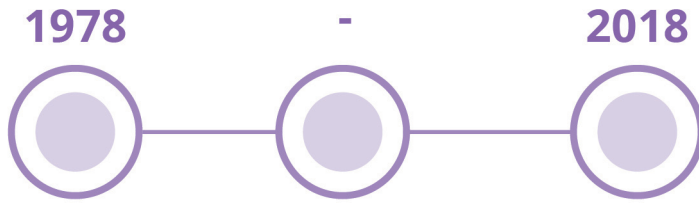

- Seeking unprecedented funding and critical enhancements in FY2018 for the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) and the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA).
- Improving protections from firearm-related domestic violence through the Domestic Abuse and Violence Prevention Initiative, which prioritizes the use of federal grants to submit domestic violence records to the National Instant Criminal Background System (NICS).
- Blocked legislation that would have made it easier for abusers with concealed weapons to stalk their victims across state lines.
- Two years of advocacy resulted in VAWA reauthorization approval in the House in early 2019.

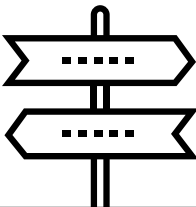
SUTHERLAND SPRINGS (WBAP/KLIF News) – Families of the victims of the Sutherland Springs Church shooting joined Senator John Cornyn Friday afternoon to celebrate recently passed legislation that seeks to improve background checks for people trying to buy guns.

The "Fix NICS" Act was signed into law by President Trump last week.

Cornyn said the bill will strengthen the criminal background check system and ensure that criminals and domestic abusers can't buy guns.

Nearly 1.5 million high school students in the U.S. are physically abused by dating partners every year.

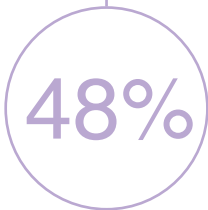

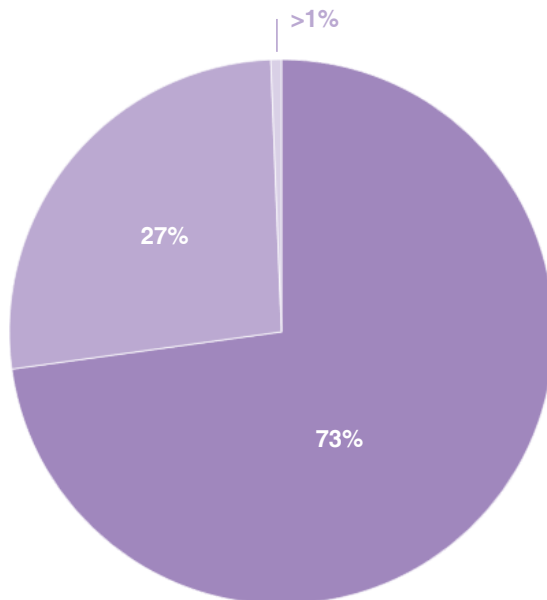

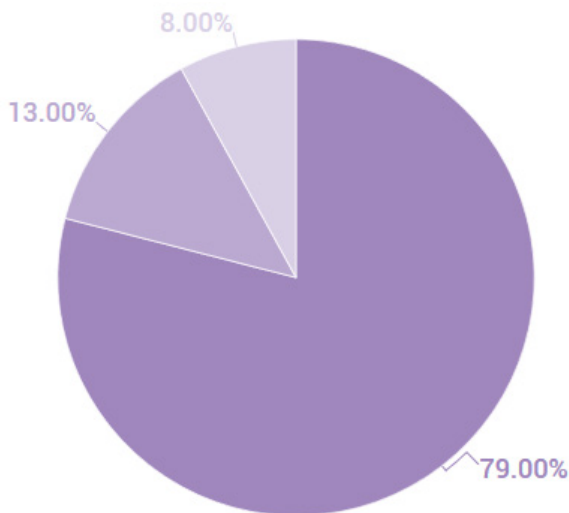
Revenue

● Investment/Other



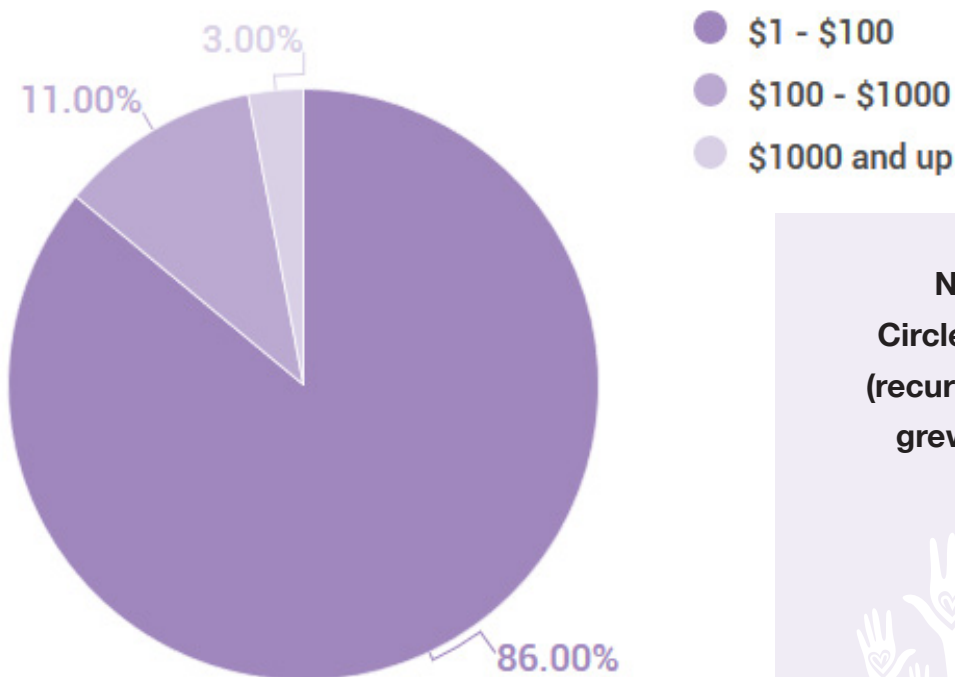
